Writing, according to Hyland (2003), necessitates composition, which connotes the capacity to either transmit facts in the form of stories or descriptions or to rewrite them into new texts, as in expository or argumentative writing.

As a result, it is seen as a continuum of tasks that vary from the more formal or mechanical parts of writing to the more complicated process of composing. Similar to this, according to Heaton (1979), writing in a foreign language requires a complex set

of skills that are challenging to learn, in contrast to mechanical skill, which is the ability to correctly use conventions unique to written language, such as spelling and punctuation. Actually, according to Harmer (2007), writing is a process that should go through several stages, including drafting, editing, planning, and the final draft. In other words, planning, reflection, and concept organization are all regarded to be part of the writing ability. Writers must not only pay attention to sentence structure, vocabulary choices, spelling, and punctuation, but also master linguistic knowledge and integrate ideas clearly and cohesively in written speech.

# Challenges experienced by students

There are several aspects of difficulties that EFL students may have in EFL writing such as poor handwriting, poor spelling skills, or problems with grammar. On the other hand, in this review, two biggest problems are clarified like coherence and cohesion that students encounter in their English essay writing. In order for the reader to readily read and understand the content, the writer should group sentences together in the text. In other words, coherence is the capacity to construct coherent, accurate sentences using the appropriate vocabulary selections and adhering to predetermined standards of word order. The following are some typical essay writing mistakes:

- -creating a paragraph without a topic sentence;
- -using controlling concepts that are overly particular;
- -having trouble coming up with a thesis statement;
- -a propensity to stray from the controlling idea.

Cohesion in EFL essay writing is another factor. Many academics concur that integrating ideas, sentences, and phrases together promotes cohesiveness. It is argued that a text can stand as a text by virtue of cohesiveness, which highlights the significance of text cohesion.

semantic readability refers to the relations of meaning that exist inside the text and characterize it as a text. To create this readability, the writer must utilize a variety of cohesive methods, including references, ellipses, conjunctions, substitutions, and lexical cohesion.

Reasons why EFL writing can be poor

The primary issue is a lack of drive. Motivation is essential for language learning success. According to Harmer (2006), there are numerous variables that contribute to learners' poor motivation, such as their anxiety of failing to demonstrate their language competence and their dread of making mistakes. It is clear that this condition is normal and widespread and that both internal and external factors may contribute to it. Teachers must encourage pupils to write often and express their ideas in order to overcome this obstacle. Second, a lack of reading is another cause of poor writing. Raimes (1998:42) underlines that the more reading pupils do, the more they are

exposed to the vocabulary, idiom, sentence structures, organizational flow, and cultural presumptions of language native speakers. Reading is regarded as a useful method to be used and valued in addition to writing strategies to improve writing proficiency. In other words, one of the factors contributing to essay writing in English that is unsatisfactory is a lack of reading.

Students' ability to write is hampered by the impact of the target language in addition to a lack of enthusiasm and reading. Each culture actually has its own means of structuring and interpreting speech, as well as its own set of rhetorical traditions. Writing is still difficult to master, and each language has its own rules that the writer must learn without interfering with another language or languages, according to Blanchard & Root (2004:203). In certain instances, it appears that pupils are ignorant of the conventions of English writing and are instead using their native tongue to think rather than the target language. As a result, they just combine words to produce their own writing, just as they would in their native tongue. Another prevalent issue that hinders the capacity to develop innovative writing is a lack of time. Lack of time can be caused by a variety of factors, including unforeseen events and needing personal time to finish responsibilities.

# Useful methods to solve the problems

Students can be advised to use writing techniques including free writing, journal writing, writing emails, and keeping diaries to overcome their writing challenges. Additionally, it might be beneficial for instructors to include computer-based writing in the curriculum so that students can practice quick drafting. To increase their vocabulary and improve their lexical usage, students should be encouraged to learn how to employ English collocation dictionaries in their writing.
