

ENHANCING LISTENING SKILLS OF EFL LEARNERS BY MEANS OF PODCASTS

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ABSTRACT

Using podcasts as authentic materials to improve listening skills has a number of advantages as highlighted below:

Immersion in Authentic Language

Podcasts provide EFL learners with authentic, real-life language input, exposing them to a wide range of accents, speech rates, and topics. According to a study by Neri, Cucchiarini, and Strik (2006), exposure to authentic listening materials helps learners become more attuned to the variations in spoken English, improving their overall listening comprehension skills. By regularly listening to podcasts, learners can familiarize themselves with colloquial expressions, idiomatic phrases, and informal language use that are commonly encountered in real-life situations.

Contextualized Vocabulary Acquisition

Podcasts offer learners opportunities to encounter new words, expressions, and phrases within meaningful contexts. The contextualized nature of podcasts aids in more effective vocabulary acquisition compared to traditional vocabulary drills or lists. Research by Wang and Wang (2019) suggests that listening to podcasts can positively impact learners' receptive vocabulary, as the continuous exposure to words in natural contexts helps reinforce their meanings through comprehension and context clues. Furthermore, the repetitive nature of podcast episodes allows learners to practice and reinforce vocabulary learning over time, leading to improved retention and application.

Interaction and Active Engagement

Podcasts offer a dynamic and interactive learning experience, capturing learners' attention through interesting topics and interactive features. This increased engagement promotes motivation and sustained involvement in the learning process.

Podcasts often incorporate interactive elements such as quizzes, discussions, and interviews, providing learners with opportunities for active engagement and participation. These interactive features promote critical thinking, note-taking, and summarizing skills, enabling learners to develop strategies for effective listening. A study conducted by Lei (2018) found that EFL learners who actively engaged with podcasts through note-taking and summarization demonstrated better listening comprehension skills compared to those who passively listened. Engaging with podcasts also encourages learners to make predictions, infer meaning, and analyze context, enhancing their overall listening proficiency.

Flexibility and Accessibility

Podcasts are readily accessible through various devices, allowing learners to engage with listening materials anytime and anywhere. This flexibility enables learners

to practice their listening skills beyond the confines of the classroom, providing opportunities for autonomous and self-paced learning.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

In another study by Thompson and Middleditch (2018), podcast listening was found to positively impact EFL learners' listening comprehension, vocabulary development, and note-taking abilities. The study highlighted the significance of learners actively engaging with authentic listening materials through podcast-based activities to improve specific listening sub-skills.

Mendelsohn (2016) investigated the effects of podcast listening on intermediate EFL learners' listening performance. Findings indicated that podcast-based listening significantly improved learners' comprehension skills, with higher proficiency students benefiting the most. The study attributed these positive outcomes to the exposure to authentic language and the opportunity to get accustomed to different accents and speaking styles.

CONCLUSION

Podcasts offer a versatile and accessible platform for EFL learners to enhance their listening skills. Immersion in authentic language, exposure to varied accents, and contextualized vocabulary acquisition are some of the key benefits that podcasts provide. Additionally, the interactive nature of podcasts promotes active engagement and critical thinking. Educators can integrate podcasts into the language learning curriculum to supplement traditional classroom instruction and create opportunities for learners to engage with real-life language contexts. By utilizing podcasts, EFL learners can strengthen their listening skills and become more confident and effective communicators in the English language.

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
