

THE ROLE OF THE FAMILY IN ORGANIZING THE INDEPENDENT ACTIVITIES OF STUDENTS IN SCHOOLS

Uzbek folk proverbs have a special place in the development of qualities such as humanity and patriotism in our children. People often use proverbs when talking to each other. A proverb is an instructive word. Such a word makes the word pleasant, makes it easier to understand the thought, makes it vivid and impressive. That is why the proverb is always a companion in people's speech. The one who uses it a lot, his speech is said to be juicy and is listened to with attention. Children's proverbs also teach about issues such as motherland and patriotism, knowledge and craft, friendship and morality, respect for elders, correct speech.

For example;

The wolf land was divided, the bear land was separated
Strength is in unity
Strength is in knowledge [3.12]

Friendship, unity, the importance of knowledge and the power of science are shown in these proverbs. Parents should help children learn these proverbs by explaining their meaning. Or:

Gold is found in grass, man is found in work. The basis of work is pleasure [4.119].

It is necessary to memorize these proverbs to the child first and ask for their meaning. This helps the child to become fluent in speech at a young age and develop his language. Children should also be told anecdotes and various stories. These form intelligence, courage and the ability to be cheerful in a child;

Latifa-Uzbeks love humor, imitation, and laughter like other peoples in the world. Laughter gives a person a sense of health, good mood, and self-satisfaction. The wise

children of our people, such as Yusufjan Khen, Aka Bukhor, Ganijon Tashmatov, shared refreshment, hope, and confidence with the people of our country even when life was difficult. Effective use of anecdotes, praises, askiya, and folk dramas gave intelligent and talented people the honor of winning people's love in the real sense.

Narratives - this word is taken from the Arabic language and expresses the meaning of story, short story. Narratives differ from legends in their closeness to life. If the legends tell about events that cannot happen, then the events in the legends often tell about specific moments in the lives of historical figures, famous scientists, and statesmen. Sometimes when we hear a story, we believe it will happen, sometimes we may not believe the story, even if it is devoid of a special fantastic image. Therefore, it is difficult to make a sharp difference between legend and narrative. In any case, based on many years of experience, it can be said that it is reasonable to accept the narration of a story that is believed, and the fact that it is impossible to believe it as a myth.

So, Uzbek folk proverbs, anecdotes and narratives are very important in developing the speech of young people and enriching their spiritual world.

Today, parents should pay attention to the following in the development of a child's speech:

- as soon as the child learns language, he should be taught manners and greetings.
- it is necessary to protect children from the vices of arrogance and pride from an early age.
- children should be encouraged to love books when they grow up and to read and share what they have read.
- it is necessary to develop children's ability to count, speak quickly, memorize poetry.

It can be concluded from the above that a boy or girl who has a mature upbringing in a family environment will think independently in the future and develop speech culture. So the family is one of the factors of language and speech development.
