Alexander Feinberg was a poet, screenwriter, translator, and writer. He lived on in his poems, screenplays, and films. The poet who conquered hearts described kindness, respect, generosity of Uzbek nationality. He spent his childhood during World War II, as he was born in 1939 in Tashkent.

### The main results and findings

In terms of his academic background, Alexander Feinberg entered the Tashkent Topographic College, after graduating from a seven-year school. After graduation from technical school, he served in the army of Tajikistan. The poet graduated from the correspondence department of journalism of the Faculty of Philology at Tashkent State University (Tashkent National University now) in 1965. He worked as a consultant in

the Uzbekistan Writers' Union during the next 4 years. In addition to this, Alexander Feinberg was a member of the Uzbekistan Writers' Union. Alexander Feinberg published more than 700 poems, many collections of poetry. Namely, "Velotracks"(1965), "Etude" (1967), "Seconds"(1969), "Poems" (1977), "Far bridges" (1978), "Answer" (1982), "Short wave" (1983), "Liberal sonnets" (1990), "Sheet" (2008). Moreover, he chaired the Seminar of Young Writers of Uzbekistan. His poems were published in the magazines "Change", "Youth", "New World", "Star of the East", "New Volga". He was not only popular in Uzbekistan but also in the world. His poems were put out an edition in the periodicals of foreign countries: like in the USA, Canada, and Israel. Familiarity with literature was absorbed from his childhood. His mother usually recited Nekrasov, Blok, Mandelstam, Yesenin, Akhmatova, Tsvetaeva, Pushkin, and Lermontov in their house. He had a love for great freedom-loving literature and deep knowledge of Russian poets. As a talented translator, he had translated works of great Alisher Navoi, Abdulla Aripov, Erkin Vokhidov, Omon Matjon from Uzbek into Russian skillfully. A Russian poet of twenties century Alexander Feinberg travelled and praised sunny Uzbekistan. He created several films in "Uzbekfilm" and "Tojikfilm" movie studio. The peak of his creativity is that he translated "Rebellion of souls" by E.Vohidov which was published in Moscow. Alexander Feinberg became one of the shining stars in the sky of Uzbek poetry. For the contribution of Feinberg, he was rewarded with Pushkin medal by Russian Federation and title of People's Poet of Uzbekistan by Republic of Uzbekistan.

He wrote in one of his essays that there was happiness on his forehead. He lived in the independent country of Uzbekitan... Uzbek poets helped him many times in terms of literature. Over the activity of his academic life, more and more writers, artists, musicians, and other professionals had been friendly to him.
